TRADING Update May 2022

I'm fully expecting this to be my last Trading Report, (thank goodness I hear you all saying) as Dan and I are progressing the hand-over quite rapidly. Thanks to all the feedback you've given over the years; it has meant a lot to me, when folks show that my utterances were not a complete waste of time. In this short report there are familiar topics and little new.

The Potato and Onion order form is included in this magazine and as you see, the prices have continued to rise, but not by as much as I had feared. We do still offer the best value for money we can. The first catalogue I have received which includes seed potatoes for 2023, has them priced at £6.95 for 1.5kg, - I'll say no more! Also we continue to rationalise our offering and reduce the order to avoid waste, but it is something we seldom get 100% correct and I apologise in advance for any disappointment caused. As always, I urge you all to order your favourites to guarantee that we can provide them.

Yet again, the Government has set a date for the withdrawal of composts containing peat. This time, the statement is for it to be illegal to sell compost containing peat from 2024. We don't know yet whether this will be followed by action but we are planning accordingly.

As usual, this year we expect to have Dobies seed catalogues with a discount offer of some sort, so when we have them, please pick up a copy at the Seed Box. Don't forget the Fothergills seeds we sell with a discount of 25% on the packet price. We are planning to have our bulk delivery in December as usual. If you want something specific, for instance a roll of netting or a complete pallet of compost, please contact us at the Seed Box or via the web site and we should be able to work out a discounted price for you. Equally if you want something not normally stocked by the FGA, ask and we will try to get it for you.

Finally an apology for the inevitable price rises we will see next year; this is totally beyond our control.

Temporary Route to the Seed Box

Some members are still having difficulty in finding the Seed Box. Hopefully, this will help: -

- Drive into the leisure centre car park and keep right
- Follow the purple hoardings to the bottom of the car park, then turn right
- At the end, either park at the top of the allotments or (if collecting compost) turn right to the Seed Box.
- Please do not park on the access road.
