Chit Chat from the Chair

After a false start, the development of the care home is re-commencing as I write this, so expect some interesting times in the next few months. We have been working closely with the Project Manager to minimise the impact on the FGA, but we may have missed something, or some issue will arise to confound us.

Please take care when visiting the Seed Box, as we learn to live with our temporary situation. Long term, we will be surrounded by the care home and will have a bigger fenced parking area, but we will not have access to anything like the parking spaces, we were able to use in the old Leisure Centre overflow car park. There will be more of this much later.

We had the AGM, again on Zoom this year, with a very disappointing turn out. Obviously we are doing a very good job or more members would have attended. It only lasted about an hour so why were you not there? My apologies to those who do not like Zoom or technology.

There was considerable discussion about adopting a peat-free compost policy and generally it was accepted as the right thing to do. However, the availability of suitable quality products across the range is not yet good. Overall it was agreed that the FGA should concentrate on peat free products where they are available. Personally I think this pragmatic approach is awkward but something we have to live with.

I wish you all a happy gardening summer and urge you to look at last year's show schedule now and plan something that you can put in the show. Many of you are reluctant to show because of the brilliant contributions from a few experienced members, so look at the novice classes if you've never exhibited before; they are for you!!! If you are growing vegetables and/or flowers, please consider entering something in the Summer Show. I can remember starting a long time ago, but that's another story.

Not really a lot happening so I've kept this very short.

TRADING Update May 2022

It's still me, as so much has been happening I have not had time to hand-over to Dan yet. After some rather hectic Saturdays we are approaching the quieter time at the Seed Box so a few observations and suggestions.

As so often, I'll start by suggesting that if you have any comment, questions, queries, etc. about anything to do with trading, do please raise it with the key holder at the Seed Box on Saturday. Alternatively you can send your comments to: - <u>enquiries@flitwickgardeners.co.uk</u> which will be forwarded as appropriate.

Potatoes and Onions – Sales went very well although there were some wonderful sprouting varieties by late May. Several people missed out on their favourite varieties, as these were fully ordered in advance. The simple answer is to order for 2023 later this year and we will do our best to make sure you get exactly what you want.

Compost – There have been very complimentary comments on our 'pay before we load' process and I'll be recommending it to our new Trading Secretary for next year! I've also been very pleased with the reception members have given the Melcourt peat-free compost and we have now nearly run out of it. The discount offer has now been changed to one similar to that operated in previous years, which is buy 4 for the price of 3 on Clover compost (only). As always, the cheapest item will be free.

Own Pack – Sales have been strong and we've struggled slightly to keep the shelves well stocked. We have leaflets describing the content of all the Own Pack items, and how to use them. Please help yourself to a copy, which is on the Own Pack shelf.

Tools - The range of tools is becoming stable and we try to have a stock of 2 for most items and 5 for the bigger sellers after the December delivery. When they are sold we do not ordering replacements.

I am regularly asked how we appear to have the same item, or very similar items, where the pricing is not consistent. We order once a year and items are priced when they are received and are never re-priced. Also we have a store room where it is not unknown for items to be mislaid and re-appear later. For some slow selling items there may be 2, 3 or more generations of the same product on the shelf, all at different prices. Over the years I have become better at avoiding these anomalies but they still occur to confuse everyone, sorry but that's life. Finally may I point out the sterling work that a couple of ladies have done to clean, dust, tidy, re-organise and basically improve the Seed Box. Thanks to them both.

2022 FGA AGM

The AGM was once again held as a Zoom meeting which probably explains why only 12 members dialled in. The chairman, Jim Godden, said 2021 had been a fairly fraught year trading wise and with the uncertainty of the new development. He was pleased with the help given to the Association from all the volunteers in various capacities and thanked them for their efforts without which the Association would not run.

The membership report shows we currently have 262 members compared with 317 at the same stage last year, with 100 members from 2021 not having renewed.

The Treasurer, Leonie Coverley, reported that we are near to completing a 3year rolling lease with the Town Council, which is in line with leases for other Flitwick Associations that use council property.

As was proposed in the last magazine, the AGM agreed an increase to £3 for the joining fee, re-joining fee, and annual subscription. This motion was passed unanimously and will come into effect from this Autumn for 2023. It was also agreed at the meeting that we should be ordering and promoting peat free compost where possible.

Hopefully next year we'll be able to have an in-person AGM and more members will turn up with suggestions on what the Association could / should be doing.

Treasurer's Update

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Dan Satterthwaite for diligently reviewing the accounts every year. I do appreciate a second pair of eyes to check everything! Dan's work usually goes quietly unseen but this year he spotted an error in the stock calculation, so I have a chance to highlight his contribution. And the great news is that the FGA made a slightly higher surplus last year than we thought! Below are the corrected figures for the 2021 Accounts:

- Closing Stock was £31,866 (original version: £31,725).
- Consequently, **Trading Surplus** was £4,292 (*original version: £4,151*).
- Overall, the Net Surplus for 2021 was £1,637 (original version: £1,496).
