Chit Chat from the Chair

Wow September already! Just recovered from last weekend's Annual Show- what a feast of flowers, vegetables and other categories there was. Most years I have great difficulty trying to choose the Chairman's best item in show. This year there was one set of three carrots which immediately drew my eye. Well done Darren, they were excellent and well deserved the award (in my opinion).

During the viewing I often hear debate trying to decide why this exhibit won and that one did not. Over the years I have guided many judges around for nearly every category in the show and fully admire their diligence in assessing items. All areas seem to have their own judging criteria set by the RHS for flowers, NVS for veg, etc, but at the end of the day it is the opinion of the judges that makes the final decision guided by those criteria. If you want to discuss why you did well or not so well, ask if the judge is still around and if possible discuss it with them to learn how to do better next time. Trust me, when escorting a judge around the show, it is difficult when they rule out your own exhibit with hardly a glance, but it is normally fully justified.

The other ongoing huge topic for the FGA has been the Care Home development. We've been working very closely with the developer to minimise the disruption but inevitably there has been some. Thanks for bearing with us in what is a difficult time. I was lucky enough to be invited to the 'topping out' ceremony, another new experience.

Dan is really coming up to speed as my replacement as Trading Secretary. In fact he is doing things I probably should have done long ago, particularly minimising the potato wastage after the 2023 'disaster'. I said it many times whilst I've been Trading Secretary but, believe me, if you do not pre-order your spuds you may well miss out on casual sales, I'm sure Dan will have a lot more to say in his Trading Report. I'd like to publicly apologise to Dan for my timing. When I suggested that I should step back and stop interfering my timing could not have been worse, our main supplier of some 20 years has decided to give up following the death of their founder.

One item that does worry me is that every year the FGA seems to end up with slightly fewer members than the previous year. I'm not sure why this is but please if you have neighbours, fellow allotment holders, etc who are not members please make them aware that we exist, where we are and that we are great value for money! Only by getting new members can we be sure the FGA has a certain future. Did you know that the FGA is affiliated to the RHS. For the rest of 2023 we have a card which will give 2 for 1 entry to all of the RHS Gardens, except on show days, full details were in the spring magazine available on the FGA website. If you would like to take advantage of the card, book it asap at the Seed Box, collect it when agreed, enjoy your visit but most importantly bring the card back to the Seed Box the following Saturday.

Last, but not least, is our eternal request for more help, two hours on a Saturday is not a lot to ask. If you can offer help, please tell us at the Seed Box, where necessary we can provide guidance and training.

TRADING Update September 2023

This has been my First year in the hot seat as the FGA Trading Secretary. I would like to thank everyone for their continued support and patience.

Please see this year's potato order form within this magazine. We have made the decision to remove Golden Gourmet shallots this year due to its very high spoilage over the last two or more years between when we receive them and you collect them. Although our prices have had to be increased by around 25p due to the increasing cost of getting them in, we are still very much the cheapest potatoes and onions you'll find anywhere near!!

Please can I encourage everyone to pre-order where possible this year to ensure you get your preferred varieties. As Jim has mentioned, I have placed a reduced order to limit the wastage compared to what we had from this year's delivery, although we should still have spare packs of many varieties. But can order more in as required.

This coming year brings the Seed Box and myself an interesting challenge with the peat free change over. Some of you may not be fully aware but as of September 2024 we will no longer be allowed to sell PEAT based products. With that in mind we have had no choice but to order this year's compost PEAT-FREE and will be selling through what remaining peat based product we have in storage. With this in mind we as a group have been creative in producing a special offer to our members to help clear the remaining peat stock. It's a make your own compost of sorts. Combining ;1 bag of Garden Peat with 3kg of Fish, Blood & Bone and finally 3kg of Horticultural sand. Please look for this offer in the compost compound as prices will be as displayed.

As usual though, this year we will have the Dobies seed catalogues with its valuable discount code, so when we have them, please pick up a copy at the Seed Box. Don't forget the Fothergills seeds we sell with a discount of 25% on the packet price.

We are planning to have our bulk delivery in December as usual. If you want something specific, for instance a roll of netting or a complete pallet of compost, please contact us at the Seed Box or via the web site and we should be able to work out a discounted price for you. Equally if you want something not normally stocked by the FGA, ask and we will try to get it for you.

Finally an apology for the inevitable price rises we will see next year; this is totally beyond our control.
