Chit Chat from the Chair

Well we've had the winter I dream of, with plenty of good frosts to kill the bugs! Not a small amount of rain to fill the aquifers so we avoid hosepipe bans. Now I'm looking forward to filling the allotment, first with onions and broad beans, but later with a vast range of things to keep us independent of the vegetable counter in the supermarket. I wonder what surprises await this year?

This year I am going back to the traditional seed bed and transplanting method for as much as possible. Alongside that I'm going to try the direct sowing for a lot of things that I've always raised in my greenhouse and then planted out. I'll let you know how I'm getting on throughout the year in my chit chats'. I suspect the greatest effect will be that the first crops will be later than I'm used to.

After a gap of several years we are trying to organise a garden visit; hopefully on Sunday 21st May. Sorry to be rather unadventurous, but it is only to Shuttleworth and will be self-drive (potentially with a bit of car sharing). We are hoping for a guided tour of the Swiss Garden for 14 people. Any expressions of interest should be made via the FGA email address or at the Seed Box. More details will be available on FGA Facebook and Web site when this has been arranged. If we get sufficient support for the Shuttleworth trip, we will consider an autumn trip to Wisley, again probably self-drive with car sharing where possible to keep costs down!

Now it is time to get that scratched record out and appeal for more help for the FGA. We generally seem to have enough helpers for till and compost hauling to get by. Unfortunately since Christmas, three key holders temporarily (I hope) have had to step back, so we could do with at least one more key holder volunteer. Chairman's Report for FGA AGM 2023

How things change! The FGA now lives hidden behind the care home development; mind you, that does make us easier to find as we're just behind the tower crane on Steppingley Road.

As always I start by thanking all those who allow FGA to exist, whether they are officers, other committee members, helpers on Saturdays, or those who weigh up all the things we sell in bags. Without you all there would be no FGA! Thank you all on behalf of all the members of FGA.

Considering everything that is going on around us, we do not appear to have been too adversely affected, as shown in the financial results. My personal thanks to Leonie, our Treasurer, for presenting the best information on our monthly financial position for every committee meeting and annual accounts in plenty of time for this AGM.

There are, as always, jobs which have been done for many years by people who would now like to move on to other roles within the FGA or outside. Apparently there is a big wide world out there, even on a Saturday afternoon, as I have found out recently when I've managed to get some time away from the Seed Box. If you could join the committee, assist with the FGA website, become Editor of the newsletter (4 a year so not too arduous) or Membership Secretary please let us know.

Over the next year we are going to have to seriously consider where we are going with the FGA! We know we are staying at the Seed Box at its present site and we will be more accessible when the development of the care home is complete, or hopefully sooner. We will then have the potential to change our opening hours.

As we have said on many occasions, we do not expect to be allowed to sell peat based compost after this year. Any gardener seeing the cost of peat free compost, may be thinking about how they are going to garden in 2024 and beyond. Patios full of pot plants and bountiful large hanging baskets may become a thing of the past. It would be good to set up something so that we can make the journey to peat free gardening together and share experiences. Watch the magazine later in the year, but if you have any ideas please share them with us.

Overall I think 2022 was another successful year although the membership numbers continued to shrink. If you have neighbours who enjoy gardening, or know allotment holders who are not members, please recommend to them that they join us. Yes our annual fee has gone up to £3 (unless you have the magazine by post), as has the joining fee but you can recover the cost with our own packs alone.

Lastly, it is good that we are having an actual AGM again this year, Zoom is alright, but to meet the members away from the Seed Box is even better.

AGM TRADING REPORT

2022 was another interesting year with the Seed Box being isolated from Steppingley Road by the Care home development. Thank goodness most of you have now managed to find us and continue to support us.

Trading was slightly down on previous years with Potato/onion sales continuing to dominate turnover. Having run out of most items of compost in 2021 we had two lorry loads of compost, which ensured plentiful availability, right to the end of the season. We also had a smaller delivery for 2023 to ensure minimal stock if Peat based compost sales are banned for 2024, as suggested by the Government.

The Seed Box would not exist without the till helpers, compost shifters and key holders. These volunteers turn up every Saturday to help you; our members, so please remember they are volunteers and treat them appropriately.

Finally, if you have any comments, questions, suggestions, etc. please see the key holder or contact us via the email address on the website. Once we know what they are, we can consider what action to take to address any comments.

Treasurer's Report 2022

2022 has been a strong trading year for Flitwick Gardeners' Association, despite some difficult circumstances, so I'll begin with thanks to all members for your support, especially those who have volunteered in various capacities! It was a relief not to be up against Covid restrictions this year, but on the other hand we've battled high inflation and the squeeze on prices – it's been a juggle to cover costs while keeping selling prices as low as we can for members.

- Overall **Sales were up** (£20,100 this year vs £19,777 prior year), especially compost sales, which have increased steadily over the last few years.
- As mentioned above, Purchase costs were significantly up (£21,728 this year vs £15,389 prior year) due to high inflation. However, this also meant Year End stock value was high so the Trading Surplus was slightly up on last year (£4,434 this year vs £4,292 last year)
- Membership income was significantly up on last year (£836 this year vs £490 prior year), reflecting the fact that 2020 and 2021 membership was combined due to the enforced Covid closures, and the recent increase in membership to £3.
- In total, the Net Surplus was £2,037 in 2022 (vs £1,638 prior year). This surplus helps provide much-needed funding to cover the ever-increasing cost base.

One area where we can expect to see higher costs in the future is for the Seed Box premises. Currently we are awaiting the Town Council to finalise the lease and invoice us accordingly for rent, so details are to be confirmed.

It was fabulous being back to the full gamut of Shows & Social events this year! This has given a financial boost to the FGA (surplus of £245 vs £50 prior year), a social boost to members (!)... and even a boost to the local community. The £174 profit from the FGA Quiz was shared equally with Keech Hospice and Flitwick Combined Charities – both are very worthwhile causes, and they really appreciated the support. Flitwick Gardeners' Association RULES

As at 5th April, 2019

- 1.Name: The name of the Association shall be the Flitwick Gardeners' Association.
- 2.**Objects**: To promote the interests of gardeners and allotment holders and to take joint action for the benefit of members; To conduct negotiations in respect of land; To take such steps as may be required by the local Authority for the good management and cultivation of allotments; To protect members from damage, trespass and theft; To arrange for instruction, lectures, discussions, exhibitions, and competitions and to distribute literature pertaining to these objectives.
- 3.**Members**: The Association shall consist of persons who are resident within the Town of Flitwick and nearby towns and villages.
- 4.Fees and Subscriptions: There will be a joining fee for all new members and for lapsed members applying to re-join after membership has lapsed in accordance with Rule 5. Every member shall pay an annual subscription, payable in advance of the due date of January 1st. Members receiving the magazine by Royal Mail shall pay an annual surcharge. The amount of the joining fee and of the annual subscription and the surcharge shall be set annually by the Annual General Meeting.
- 5.Arrears: Any member who is three months in arrears with his subscription shall be deemed to have ceased to be a member unless explanation is given to the Committee in writing of extenuating circumstances.
- 6.**Officers**: The Officers shall be Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary and Trading Secretary. All Officers shall be ex-officio members of the Executive Committee.
- 7.**Committee**: The affairs of the Association shall be conducted by an Executive Committee of not less than eight members. A quorum shall be of not less than five members. Vacancies arising may be filled by co-option on the authority of the Executive Committee. All members shall retire annually, and a fresh Committee be elected at each Annual General Meeting. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-election.
- 8.**General Meetings**: An Annual General Meeting shall be held during March or April each year. 14 days' notice shall be given, and a quorum shall be ten members. At the meeting shall be presented the Secretary's Report and a set of Examined Accounts and the Officers and Executive Committee Members elected for the coming year. The Financial Year shall be from the First of January until the Thirty-First of December. The Secretary shall have authority to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting at any time after giving the due notice, but he shall always do so if so requested by no less than ten general members in writing.

- 9. **Discussions at Meetings**: No party political or sectarian discussions shall be raised, or resolutions proposed, at any Committee, sub-committee or General Meeting of the Association.
- 10.**Funds**: The Committee shall open an account with a Bank selected by the Executive Committee in the name of the Flitwick Gardeners Association and all monies received from any source on behalf of the Association shall be passed through the Treasurer or his nominee to be paid into the account. Cheques shall be signed by two signatories authorised by the Executive Committee one of whom shall always be the Treasurer or his nominee. But cheques may be signed by one Officer below £100.
- 11. Association Accounts: The end of year accounts shall be examined by an examiner who is not a member of the Executive Committee and submit their report to the Annual General Meeting.
- 12.**Affiliation**: The Association shall affiliate itself to any suitable Group providing it is non-political or non-sectarian and shall pay such annual affiliation fees as may from time to time be prescribed. Nominees may be appointed to represent the Association at the various organisations as determined from time to time.
- 13. Offences: The Executive Committee may terminate the membership of a member whose conduct is proved to their satisfaction to be detrimental to the Association or to the interests of his/her fellow members. Any charge against a member must be communicated in writing. An appeal from a decision of the Executive Committee may be made to a Special General Meeting on the requisition in writing of three members to the Secretary who will convene an Extraordinary General Meeting as soon as possible to hear the appeal.
- 14. Conversion, Dissolution, Etc. The Association may be converted into a registered society, or may be dissolved, or these rules may be amended by a two-thirds majority of those present at a General Meeting convened with the due fourteen days' notice. The notice convening the General Meeting shall list the reason(s) for calling it.
- 15.Matters arising not covered by these Rules: Any matter not covered by the rules may be dealt with by the Executive Committee at its sole discretion.

Temporary Route to the Seed Box

Some members are still having difficulty in finding the Seed Box. Hopefully, this will help: -

- Drive into the leisure centre car park and keep right
- Follow the purple hoardings to the bottom of the car park, then turn right
- At the end, either park at the top of the allotments or (if collecting compost) turn right to the Seed Box.
- Please do not park on the access road.
