#### Chit Chat from the Chair

As another growing year approaches its finale of the FGA's Autumn Show, it will soon be time for you to select your best, smallest, longest or heaviest entries. There's always plenty of friendly help on hand, so please support us and bring your entries to the Village Hall before 2pm on Saturday 11th October.

Given the very dry spring and summer and multiple heatwaves, the quality of the exhibits at this year's Summer Show were particularly impressive. A testament to the enthusiasm and skill (and watering) of our members. Whilst not all plants and trees have enjoyed this year's warm dry weather, it has been a welcome boon for butterflies after last year's wet and cool summer which represented a low point in a downward trend for butterflies. We can all support butterfly conservation by mowing our lawn less (that's how I justify it to my wife!), planting more native flowers or nectar-rich flowers with an open habit, and prolonging flowering by deadheading and mulching. So as you peruse the Dobies catalogues (available from the Seedbox soon) or our new range of Kings Seeds, please consider butterflies - in your planting choices and in finding space for flowers in your garden, balcony, pots or allotments. There's some great resources available at <u>Butterfly Conservation</u>.

There is no change to the arrangements for Dobies seeds and catalogues should appear as usual at the end of Sept/beginning of October and you can put in one order for all you need or put in several orders at different times of the year.

#### **TRADING Update September 2025**

As always, I would like to thank everyone for their continued support at the Seedbox and the members who continue to come down and purchase from us. Without this we would not be able to continue to supply products at the low prices we offer.

Please continue with helping to move your compost to your car when you are able, it is greatly appreciated. This year you all joined us in using peat-free products and surprised us with the demand for certain products. The good news is that we will be getting more of what you want in ready for next year and keep an eye out when in the Seedbox for possible additional offers.

We are moving into potato and onion season as usual. Again, as you can appreciate the price has changed slightly. But as those who order year on year you know that we are still amazing value for the amount you get. Please tell your neighbours, fellow allotmenteers and strangers about this! Potatoes and onions are ordered from our supplier based on your pre-order demand so please take the time to drop off your sheets as early as possible to avoid disappointment. We have kept the same verities and again will have a new variety for you all to sample. And please give us your feedback for the Francis variety given out last year.

We have a change of seed supplier coming this month. We will again be stocking up over the close down period. Make note that we again continue trading until the end of November and then shut down for December with late January being mainly for Potato and Onion collections. I would also like to remind everyone that we offer our own brand of food and fertilisers. Great products that save you money and offer more volume than those in the prepacked boxes and bottles. I implore you to take one of our Own pack cheat sheets and I think you will be surprised what you can add to help yield great results with your planting.

Wishing you every planting success and don't neglect your beds over winter.
